What undergraduate students should know about I-O Psychology

- Industrial-organizational (I-O) psychology applies scientific principles to improve the workplace
 - Hiring employees, performance evaluation, employee motivation, training and development, teamwork, organizational development and change, and leadership
- I-O psychology is the highest-paying field within psychology
 - Median wage \$77,350¹
- I-O psychologist is one of the fastest-growing occupations in the U.S.
 - 19% job growth (2012-2024)²
- I-O psychologists work in a variety of settings
 - Businesses, government, universities, consulting firms, and research organizations

How to Become an I-O Psychologist

- Most professionals working in the field of I-O psychology hold a Master's or Doctoral degree.*
- Hundreds of universities offer graduate degrees in I-O psychology
 - Some universities have undergraduate I-O psychology concentrations
