# **Community and Civic Engagement Minor**

Requirements for the Community and Civic Engagement Minor:

- 15 credit hours with a minimum of 9 credits at the 3000-level or higher
- 1 hour Capstone Course. Students must have completed 15 credit hours toward the minor prior to enrollment in Capstone.
- Students must take at least one course from each of the four CCE categories (Context; Issues; Skills, Tools, & Methods; and Service-Learning, Experiential Learning)
- The additional course may be taken in any of the four categories.
- Courses taken in fulfillment of the College Core or for other majors and minors may not be counted toward the Community and Civic Engagement minor.
- GPA in the minor must be a minimum of 2.5.
