This class will meet Mondays from 12 to 12:50 in Haley for readings and discussions about Baroque art: painting, architecture, sculpture, music, fashion, furnishings, cuisine, and some literature, to include theatre and poetry. Pertinent films will be also viewed (*Artemisia*, *Il mondo nuovo*, and *Farinelli*). Highlight of this course: the Carnevale celebrations at Auburn, sponsored by the Italian Club and the Department of Italian, at the end of January/beginning of February.

This class is a Languages Across the Curriculum offering. Enrollment in both FLIT3200 (1 credit) and ARTS3740 (3 credits) is highly recommended but not required.
