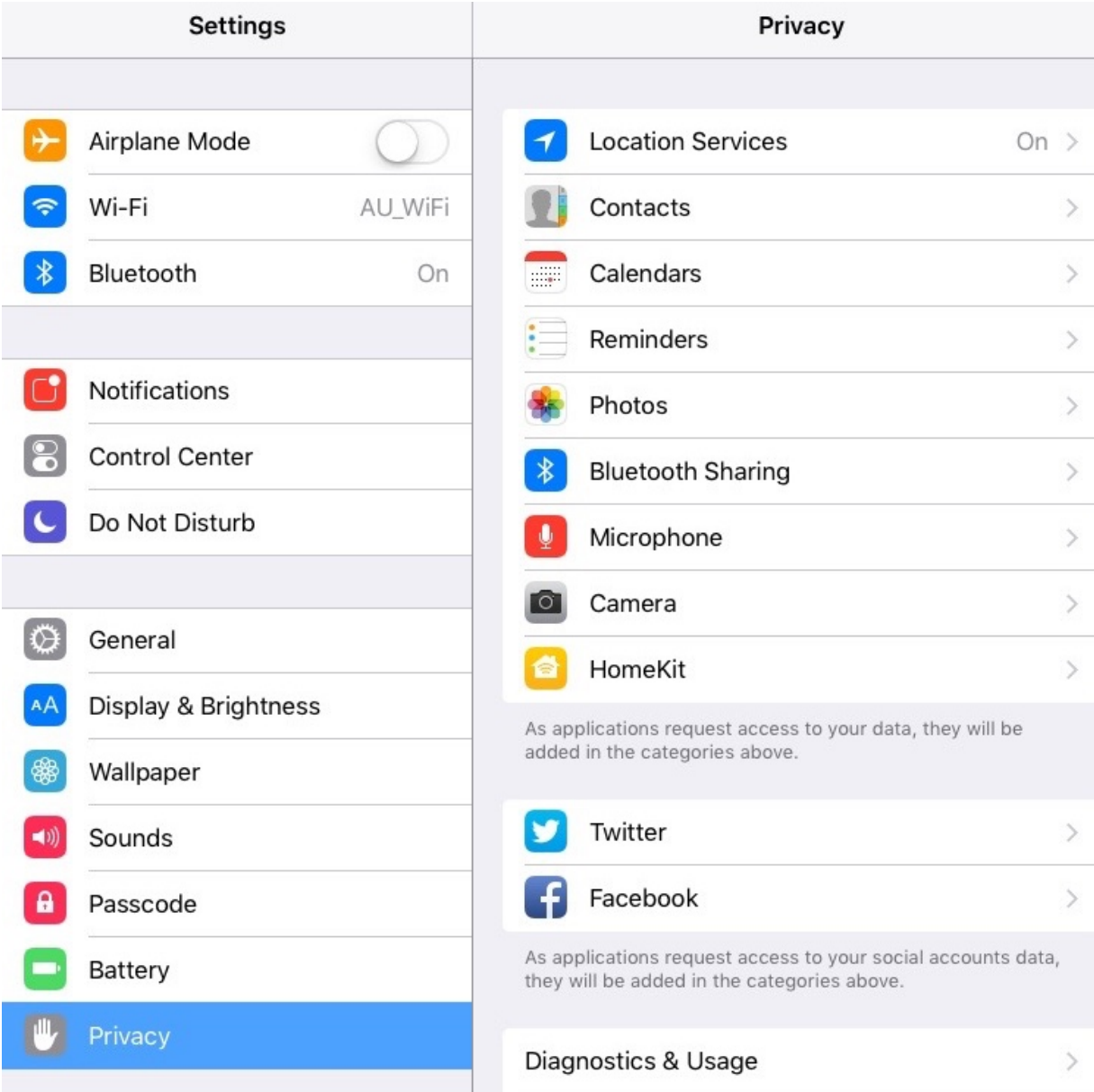


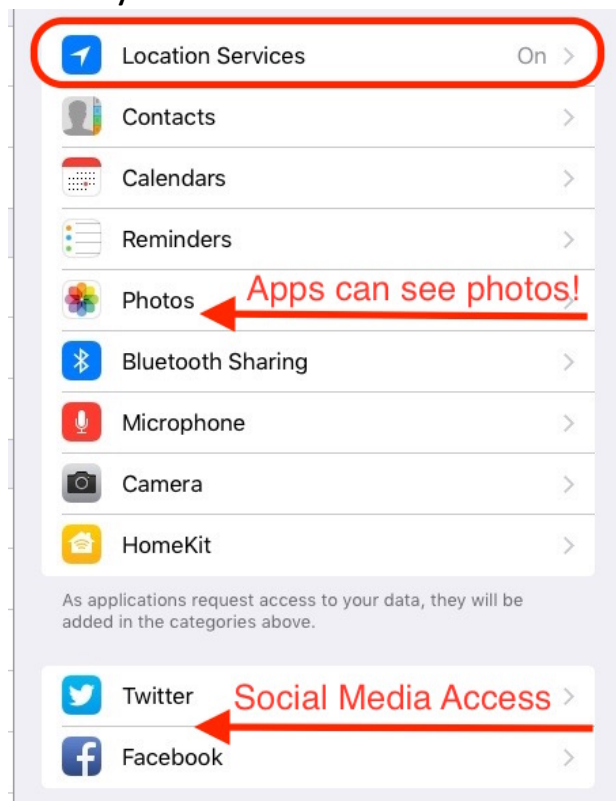
# Privacy Settings

These are a matter of preference. However, for those who want to be more private with their information, use these settings to ensure privacy. These options control both Apple's can access to your information and apps that you install on your device. It is good from time to time to check on these settings as you add new apps that may now have access.



## Privacy Settings

One of the main features to adjust is Location Services. This will not only prevent tracking; it will save on battery life.



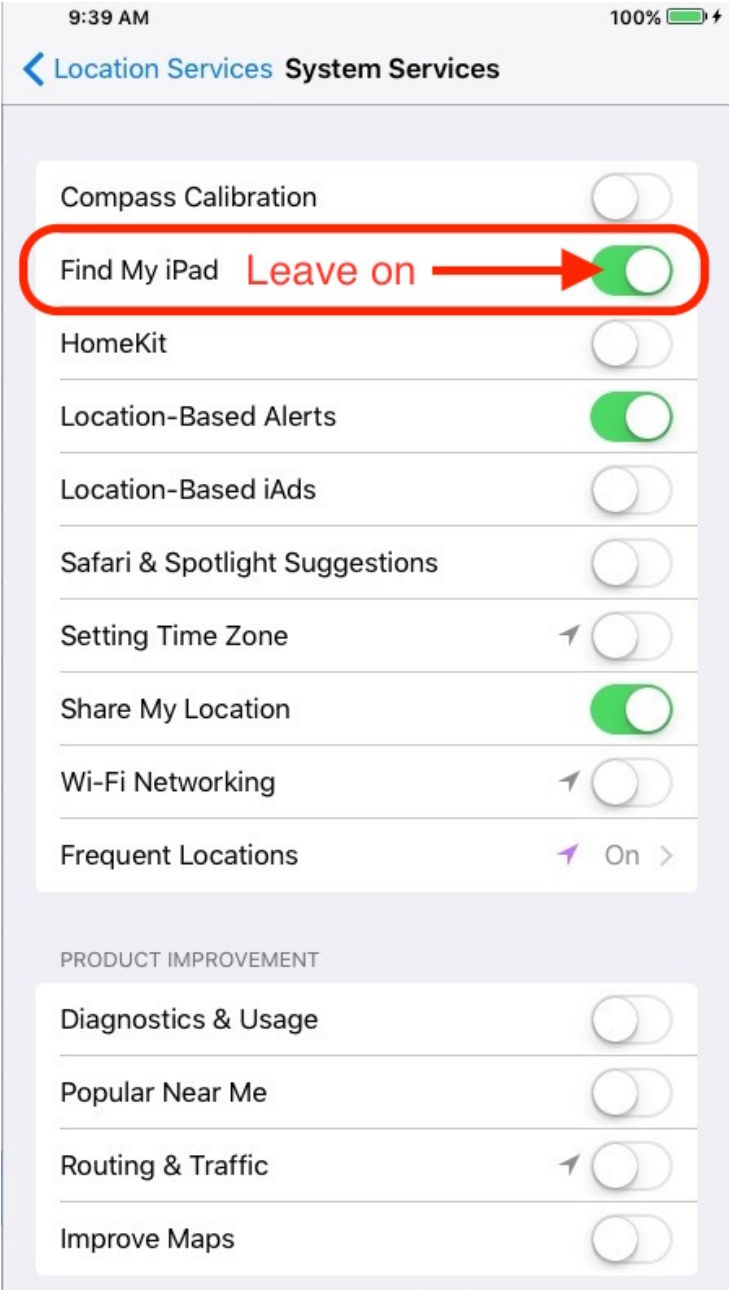
Location Services deals with your GPS information and what can access it. By default, all Location Services options are on.

Turn off options that you do not think you will use. You can always turn them back on in the future if the need arises.

Location-Based Alerts is a good feature to leave on. It is how law enforcement and other agencies share vital information. An example would be if a child is kidnapped near your location, an Amber Alert will be issued to your phone to inform you and how to help if you have information.

It is important to leave **Find My iPad** on if you plan on using that feature. It is a great feature that allows you to recover your iPad if misplaced or stolen.

A feature to turn off is the Frequent Locations. This feature tracks your movements constantly in order to learn where you go frequently. It can determine where your home, work, and often visited places. It keeps a record of your locations down to an address. As well as pins on a map to be viewed later.
