Twenty-seven percent (27%) of the PhD graduates from our program during the 10-year period that ended Summer 2023 earned Master's degrees (that required successful defense of a thesis) from other institutions prior to admission to our PhD program, and were able to use the thesis and some of the coursework completed at those other institutions to fulfill some of our program requirements. Those students completed our program in an average of 5 years (median 6 years), compared to an average of 5 years (median 6 years) for the other students.
