CPLN 7240	<b>Quantitative methods for Planning</b> Development of working knowledge of planning techniques such as data collection, basic statistics, demographic analysis, economic analysis, social research, transportation, and evaluation.	<b>3 CORE</b>
CPLN 7430	<b>Land Use Law</b> This course covers three key elements of the planning profession: ethics, law and plan implementation.	<b>3 CORE</b>
